1	The Governor and the NHS England Health and Justice Commissioner should ensure that there is a pathway in place to address prisoners' needs when they are ready to return to prison after hospital discharge but the holding prison is unable to meet the prisoner's healthcare requirements.	Accepted	<p>Existing practice is for healthcare and prison staff to assess, discuss, arrange a return of a prisoner from hospital to an appropriate prison place. Where the sending prison is no longer able to meet the health needs of the returning prisoner, prison Deputy Governors and Heads of Healthcare can bilaterally negotiate a return to a different prison.</p> <p>Where a suitable place cannot be secured the escalation process is followed. This entails the prison managers escalating to the Women's Directorate operations manager to secure a suitable placement promptly.</p> <p>More generally, this is being considered at the Surrey Female Partnership Board and more widely across the Women's Estate with the Prison Group Director's</p>	Governor & NHS England Health and Justice Commissioner	<p>Complete</p> <p>2022/2023</p>
