The bag seal number is located on the Safeguarding log for all Officers in charge to have reference to this. This bag is the only HMPPS one in use. Any missing items are recorded on the Safeguarding log and a request for a replacement is reported to healthcare.	Governor	Complete
5	The Governor should remind and encourage all prisoners to use panic alarms to alert staff of emergency situations, when safe to do so.
