1	The Director, Head of Healthcare and Senior Probation Officer at HMP Peterborough should review how substance misuse information is shared internally, and with key partners including Community Offender Managers and housing providers.	Accepted	HMP Peterborough will conduct a review of the information sharing between key stakeholders. The review will include the internal Offender Management Unit (OMU), external Community Offender Managers, the prison reception team and Northamptonshire Healthcare Foundation Trust who are commissioned to deliver substance misuse services. The outcomes will be agreed via an onsite forum coordinated by the internal Head of Safety and Security. 2	The Head of East and West Lincolnshire Probation Delivery Unit should ensure that staff create licence conditions which are accurate and relevant for the service user.	Accepted	All probation practitioners are advised to utilise the Effective Proposal Framework 2 tool to support the identification of appropriate licence conditions. Going forward Senior Probation Officers (SPO) will monitor this during supervision and case audit activity with probation practitioners. The Probation Delivery Unit (PDU) head will monitor this further in management meetings.  In addition a learning point will be shared with all staff to better enable the identification of appropriate substance misuse treatment providers. 3	The Head of East and West Lincolnshire Probation Delivery Unit should ensure that when a service user moves to a new area, staff make the appropriate Integrated Offender Management referral.	Accepted	A revised national Integrated Offender Management (IOM) Strategy has been launched in Lincolnshire in which the cohort covering female offenders will be a priority. Strategy documents make explicit reference to the transfer of IOM nominals to other areas, and there is work ongoing to develop national policy guidance to support this process. This learning point was raised in the regional IOM Senior Probation Officer meeting in August 2022 and will also be raised in national forums by the IOM East Midlands Lead.
