1	<p>The Governor and Head of Healthcare at Frankland should ensure that staff:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - open an ACCT if a prisoner expresses suicidal thoughts; - start ACCT monitoring procedures when a prisoner has significant risk factors, or record their reasons for not doing so; and - consider opening a CSIP when prisoners disclose that they are in debt or appear fearful of other prisoners. 	Accepted	<p>A new version of ACCT (version 6) was rolled out nationally in July 2021. As part of the roll out, managers received awareness training on the new version and how to use ACCT to support prisoners at risk of self-harm and suicide. The training provides guidance on identifying risks and triggers and reviewing an individual's level of risk. It also provides advice on when to open an ACCT, including if a prisoner expresses suicidal thoughts or has significant risk factors, and what to record if the decision is made not to open an ACCT.</p> <p>Additionally, all managers at HMP Frankland have undergone further training on ACCT processes and quality assurance checks have been put in place. The safety team has also produced a 'Know Your Prisoner' one page quick guide for staff that highlights potential triggers and risk factors for prisoners who are considered vulnerable.</p> <p>Staff have been advised through internal publications, weekly newsletters and PowerPoint</p>	Head of Safer Custody HMPPS	Completed



			<p>presentations that they should consider using CSIP to support a prisoner where they have disclosed that they are in debt or appear fearful of other prisoners. The safety team has also recently delivered a CSIP awareness course to relevant managers who will cascade the relevant information to their respective teams.</p> <p>Additionally, staff have been advised that information from the security department can also instigate a CSIP referral, where appropriate. The security department is aware of this process to ensure that communication between departments is clear and consistent.</p>		
2	The Governor of Garth should remind staff that, subject to a risk assessment, staff enter cells as quickly as possible if there is reason to consider that a prisoner may be at risk.	Accepted	In February 2022 a Governor's Order was published providing clear instructions on entering cells. It reminded staff that they should conduct a dynamic risk assessment without delay at the prisoner's door, taking into account any known factors and the category of prisoners at the establishment.
