

## Frequently asked questions

1. Will working with prisons affect my brand reputation?

—  
No, many leading businesses already partner with prisons from Wates to Timpson and Muller. Far from being a reputational risk, involvement demonstrates strong corporate social responsibility, commitment to sustainability, and tangible social value.

2. Why should my business get involved?

—  
Commercial benefit. You gain access to a motivated and skilled workforce, expand your supply chain capacity, and demonstrate clear social impact by reducing reoffending. Evidence shows that prisoners who secure work within a year of release are significantly less likely to reoffend.

3. What kind of work can be done in prison workshops?

—  
Workshops cover a wide range: packing, assembly, manufacturing, textiles, print, call centres, recycling, farming, and more. Businesses can run dedicated host workshops inside prisons or outsource specific production tasks.

4. What support will my business receive from New Futures Network and prisons?

—  
You won't be left to figure things out alone. New Futures Network provides a Business Account Manager to guide you through each step, from scoping requirements to setting up workshops. Inside prisons, industry instructors and HMPPS staff oversee training, quality assurance, and day-to-day operations. This support ensures your investment runs smoothly.

5. What are the costs to my business?

—  
In a host workshop, businesses cover wages for staff and prisoners plus some overheads, in return for goods/services produced. In a production model, you pay for outsourced work as you would with any supplier. New Futures Network ensures arrangements are commercially sustainable.

6. How is it quality assured?

—  
Prison industries are overseen by experienced instructors. Many workshops already meet industry standards. Businesses often provide specialist tools and training to ensure outputs meet their specifications.
