VIP Events



In addition to a huge range of fantastic online and in-person group events, many of our hosts went **above and beyond** to offer some truly unique **VIP experiences** for one or two people to enjoy. These experiences offered opportunities for staff to spend the day in someone else's shoes or get exclusive behind the scenes access to parts of our system they would **not normally get to see**.

Senior leaders and front-line operational staff across HMPPS and partners graciously donated their time to be **shadowed** for the day, or have a **coffee and conversation** with individuals about their work or personal leadership journey. We had **behind the scenes tours** of historically important buildings, such as the **Royal Courts of Justice**, the **Four Inns of Court**, and the **House of Lords** (which was expertly provided by the **Bishop of Gloucester!**). We also had a range of opportunities for staff to **work alongside**

colleagues for the day in a different department. This included ride-alongs with the **Metropolitan Police**, a chance to get involved in **Community Payback**, and opportunities to accompany security teams on prison **intelligence-led interventions**.

Feedback from hosts and attendees suggests that these experiences were mutually beneficial:

Allegra Joly (Activities Custodial Manager, HMP Brixton) had the opportunity to shadow **James Timpson OBE** (CEO of Timpson Ltd.) for the day. Allegra said, "'I got to meet Mr Timpson and spend the day with him going round lots of Timpson shops and meeting a whole host of the team. It was such a great learning experience. I would have never got the opportunity to make that connection without the festival!".

James Timpson said he also benefited from taking part: "It was my pleasure to facilitate this Insights22 event. Timpson now employs over 600 prison leavers and having the opportunity and privilege to showcase some of the fantastic service they offer to the public is extremely satisfying to me personally."

Neil White (HMPPS Performance & Quality Officer) had the chance to accompany **Amy Rees** (Director General for Probation, Wales, and Youth) to a **Probation Operational Management Committee** (POMC) meeting. Neil was impressed with how focused the meeting was ("*no waffle*"!), and felt reassured that senior leaders were attempting to address the most pressing challenges in the Probation Service.

Jane Stead (HMPPS Digital Senior Content Designer) enjoyed a 'coffee and chat' with Claire Wilson, a senior policy manager in the Probation Reform Programme. Jane described Insights22 as "the most educational 2 weeks of (her) year" and that she has now "happily added Clare to (her) list of new 'insightful' colleagues".

10 - A Day in the Life of a Court Officer

The Insights22 Festival was kicked off by John Todd-Kvam and colleagues from the Norwegian University of Life Sciences, talking about desistance in penal practice in Norway. This popular online event provided us with some valuable lessons around the importance of relationships and culture in prison. Prison Reform Trust delivered a session on the importance of the voice of those with lived experience in prison reform, while Kerry Ellis-Devitt from University of Portsmouth talked about some of the ethical considerations of conducting lived experience research with perpetrators of serious violent and sexual offences.

In Wellingborough, we had the first of three tours of **HMP Five Wells**, the UK's newest prison run by **G4S**, where attendees heard about the integration of smart technology throughout the design and a focus on rehabilitative outcomes like education, employment and building family ties. **HMP Full Sutton** and **HMP Doncaster** also welcomed guests today, while visitors to **HMP Gartree** tested out their thespian talents with **Shakespeare Unbard**.

Back online, we had an interesting session on the important role that the **Probation Service** plays in providing **advice to the Court**, while **Alison Clarke**, **North Midlands Prison Group Director**, hosted a session on supporting **care leavers** in custody. We were also joined by **Anne Fox**, **CEO at Clinks**, who

raised awareness of the impact that the pandemic had on our **voluntary sector partners** and how we in HMPPS can support them.

Tuesday 10th May 2022



We were treated to some great examples of partnership working in Probation today, with sessions from staff **co-located at a Women's Centre** in West Midlands, staff who work with the **Home Office in the management of Foreign National Offenders**, and a showcase of the **Yorkshire and The Humber Probation** region's joined-up response to homelessness during the pandemic.

Bringing evidence into practice, **Insights Group** led sessions on how to **de-bias decision-making**, and the research on **people who sexually reoffend** whilst under supervision. We were also joined by **MoJ** and several expert partner agencies who talked to us about **best practice for working with ethnically diverse women** in the Criminal Justice System.


We were delighted to welcome **Spring Films** and film director **Paddy Wivell** back to **HMP Durham** today following the production of their multi award-winning Channel 4 documentary '**Prison**'. Hosted by **Ian Blakeman, HMPPS Executive Director,** staff and people in prison engaged in a conversation with the panel on the benefits, challenges, and ethical implications of filming inside prison walls.

In London, a small group experienced what it was like to be a **Prisons and Probation Ombudsman** Investigator for the day, while in Newton Abbot, **HMP Channings Wood** showcased their prison workshops and their partnership with **Storybook Dads**.

Online, we learned more about the **HMPPS Twinning Project**, linking prisons with local professional football clubs to engage people with football-based programmes that also provide them with qualifications for release. We had an interesting session from the **National Security Division** and **Joint Extremism Unit** on **managing the threat of terrorism**, and were also joined by international members of the **Confederation of European Probation**, sharing their countries' approaches to **tackling domestic abuse**.

Wednesday 11th May 2022



Another exceptionally full day of events today, bringing evidence into practice and showcasing innovation. HMP Guys Marsh, HMP Drake Hall, HMP Hewell and even our Scottish colleagues at HMP Edinburgh all welcomed visitors today, while HMP Parc showcased their work with families through their Invisible Walls project.


In Sheffield, visitors were treated to demonstrations of the latest digital services on offer at the HMPPS Digital Studio, whilst in Manchester, guests learned more about the Prisoner Escort and Custody Services. Online, attendees had the chance to observe a demo of a polygraph examination, and learn more about how it is used to enhance risk management. HMPPS Assurance, Risk Management, and Governance (ARMG) held two session today, helping us to better understand the life cycle of thematic inspections and also explaining how they use external data to enhance their scrutiny work.

One year on from the unification of Probation services in England, Executive Director Jim Barton and Deputy Director Spencer Draper offered their reflections on the implementation of the Probation Reform Programme, and South West Regional Probation Director Angela Cossins engaged staff in a discussion about making better use of social media in the Probation Service. We had an interesting session from the Disabilities Trust on supporting people with brain injuries, while the HMPPS

Interventions team also shared useful practical tips on how to work with people with learning disabilities.

We were pleased to include MoJ's Arms Length Bodies in the Festival this year, and today we had a useful overview of the work of the **Office of the Public Guardian** who support people who have lost mental capacity. The **Legal Aid Agency** also delivered a session today, providing guests with an interesting insight into **personality types** using the Myers Briggs Type Indicators (MBTI).

Bringing research to life, Richard Vince, HMPPS Executive Director of Security, was joined by Professor Ben Crewe, Dr Susie Hulley (University of Cambridge) and Dr Serena Wright (Royal Holloway University of London) who shared their research on the experiences of life imprisonment by those sentenced in young adulthood. We also had a session hosted by NHS England and the Institute for Public Safety, Crime and Justice, sharing the findings of their study into the perinatal care provided to women at HMP Peterborough. To top things off, the Policy, Evaluation and Research Unit (PERU) at Manchester Metropolitan University gave us some useful tips on how to do qualitative research effectively.



Thursday 12th May 2022




The pandemic has had a significant impact on staff across criminal justice, so the **MoJ Wellbeing Roadshow** today was a timely reminder of the range of support services available to staff. There were also opportunities to reflect on how we have adapted our services in response to the pandemic. Events included learning from the delivery of **remote parole hearings** by **Sheffield Hallam University**, how **domestic abuse services** have responded in **Northern Ireland**, and reflections on how effectively **Gold Command** operated in the prison service.

Up in Leeds, **St John's Approved Premises** invited guests for a tour and a spot of lunch, while in London the **HMPPS Third Sector Grants and Partnerships team** engaged attendees in a discussion about effective partnership working with the voluntary sector. In Birmingham, guests were treated to a live performance by **Geese Theatre's Community Ensemble**, members of which have been exploring their personal and collective recovery journeys through the performing arts. Also sharing their stories with us today were the **Probation Peer Mentors** who explained how they went from being under probation supervision themselves to now supporting others.

Online, the **HMPPS Drug Strategy Team** explored the realities of the impact of **psychoactive substances** in prison, while the **Youth Justice Board** revealed the work that they have been doing recently, mapping out the youth justice system to see how organisations can better work in partnership to improve outcomes.

In the world of technology, the MoJ Data Science Hub pitted man against machine to see which was more effective at reading the Probation case management system, and we also learned about the work of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Authority (CICA) and Circles of Support and Accountability (CoSA).

Friday 13th May 2022



Our first week of the Festival ended with events that reflected changes to working practices since the pandemic, with a session from **Unlocked Graduates** on how to best make use of technology to improve engagement with staff, and another from **Run For Your Life** on how to support your team remotely.

In Kent, ticket holders had a unique chance to sneak a peak at the development of the **UK's first children's secure school** and hear about **Oasis'** vision for the future. In London, **Amanda Pinto QC** gave our VIP guests a tour of the **Four Inns of Court** and **London Probation region** gave an interesting overview of their **Offender Personality Disorder Pathway.**

The **HMPPS Rehabilitative Culture team** gave us a really useful update on the culture work that they are doing across 12 pilot prison sites in England & Wales, and **Penal Reform Solutions** talked to us about the specific work that they are doing at **HMP Hewell** to develop positive relationships between staff and people in prison.

Dr Kirstine Szifris, Manchester Metropolitan University, talked to us about the innovative work that she has been doing, **teaching philosophy** to people in the long term, maximum security estate and the benefits this has had in helping them to build positive relationships and explore what it means to live a good life. **Sam Pemberton, University of Birmingham**, shared his research on the **experiences of women post-release**, and how we can better work together to support them and improve outcomes.

Nina Champion, Director of Criminal Justice Alliance, led an informal lunchtime chat about what it takes to be a **leader for social change**, reflecting on her own leadership journey, and **Ed Cornmell** took part in

a Q&A with **Gill Attrill, Deputy Director for Insights Group**, reflecting on his experiences as **Lead Gold Commander** for prisons during the pandemic.

After a full and exciting week, it was great to take time to unwind and enjoy a **mindfulness session** with Mindfulness Coach and BBC Radio 4's 'Thought for the Day' contributor, **Vishvapani Blomfield**. A chance to relax, reflect, and get ready for another jam-packed week next week!





Monday 16th May 2022




The second week of the Festival kicked off in style with a VIP tour of the **Royal Courts of Justice** in London (avoiding the paparazzi), expertly guided by colleagues from the **National Justice Museum**. In Leeds, the **Pride in Prisons and Probation (PiPP)** network gave some useful tips on recognising and challenging inappropriate and discriminatory behaviour in the workplace, and guests in Nottingham experienced a taster of the **Thinking Skills** accredited programme. In Bolton, guests visited the **HM Pasties Bakery**, which was set up by ex-offender **Lee Wakeham** and now provides a successful transitional employment programme for people leaving prison.

We were honoured to be joined by award-winning writer and broadcaster Claudia Hammond today, in conversation with Helen Bagnall, Artistic Director at Salon London, who spoke about the 'Art of Rest', and its inextricable links to wellbeing. We also heard from leading criminal justice academic Shadd Maruna (Queen's University, Belfast), who joined User Voice to talk about how to do participatory user research well, and the findings of their recent research into the impact of Covid-19 on people in prison.

We had two events today aimed at improving our understanding of violence so that we can improve our practice. HMPPS Interventions team talked us through the biopsychosocial model of violence, while Dr Kate Gooch (University of Bath) drew our attention to her research into the relationship between early

tragedy and violence in young men. HMPPS Interventions led a further session today to improve our understanding of **why people join gangs** and what works to support their disengagement from them.


In support of the **recruitment** drive across HMPPS, we were pleased to work in collaboration with **workforce leads** across prison, probation and YCS to deliver four careers sessions during Insights22. Open to the general public, these events showcased the different **careers available across HMPPS**, with opportunities for attendees to ask questions directly to staff already working in those roles.

I took so much away from User Voice, Mark Johnson and Shadd Maruna on the HMPPS Insights gathering on 'prison research conducted by those inside'. Tonnes of wisdom on the call.

In particular, I was griped with by mantra. 'Nothing About Us Without US' which essentially outlines that any service constructed to support people with a particular lived-experience needs to be: conceived, structured and delivered by (i.e. equal paid positions right up the organisation chart) those the service aims to assist. It's a no brainer and challenges our (my) limited notions of what 'service user involvement' is. Mark Johnson made a great point of moving away from the language of service user involvement, in favour of forging genuine 'Partnerships' with people with lived experience.

So much was said that I could comment on further but I'll end it here as I need to digest what I've listened to and consider how I need to adapt in response.

Tuesday 17th May 2022



Today was a particularly busy day for the **Co-Financing Organisation (CFO)**, with four of their Activity Hubs opening their doors at **Manchester**, **Stoke**, **Bristol** and **Chatham**. We also had opportunities to have a tour of **HMP Bronzefield** women's prison, and to see the innovative digital work that **Code4000** are doing at **HMP Humber**. Some of us had a chance to work in a prison kitchen at **HMPYOI Brinsford** today while others got to meet the people in prison working at **The Clink** restaurant at **HMP Highdown** and enjoy a spot of lunch!

We were delighted to include the Police Service in the Insights Festival this year. In addition to opportunities to accompany the **Metropolitan Police** on ride-alongs in London, **Staffordshire Police** also welcomed Insights22 guests to visit a police custody suite in Etruria today. It was great to also showcase the resettlement and public protection work going on in some of our Approved Premises, with tours of **Jackie Harriet House** in Birmingham, and an overview of the psychologically informed planned environment (PIPE) at **Peterborough AP**.

While East Midlands Probation Region were giving guests a taster of the Building Better Relationships programme in Derby, the HMPPS Interventions team gave an overview of Horizon, a strengths-based programme for people convicted of sexual offences. HMPPS in Wales also showcased interventions today, with a workshop on restorative practices. We were also joined online by yet another seminal probation academic, Hazel Kemshall (DeMontford University), who explained the art of decision-making in risk management.

The HMPPS Staff Networks were back again today with workshops on how to be an effective ally, and race in the LGBTI community. We had a really interesting session from the HMPPS Effective Practice & Service Improvement Group (EPSIG) on county lines. Working Chance gave a us some tips and techniques on how to practically embed lived experience in policy and service improvement, and the

Mulberry Bush talked to us about the importance of **therapeutic approaches** and interventions with children who are in the Criminal Justice System.

Thanks to **Legal Aid Agency** who joined us again today, for a session on **domestic abuse awareness**, and also from their **CEO Jane Harbottle** who drew on her own leadership experiences to engage in a conversation about **self limiting beliefs**.

Wednesday 18th May 2022



The Insights Festival is all about bringing people together, and what better way to do that than to 'buss a lime' with the **Breaking Down Barriers** (BDB) leadership team! Not only did guests get to enjoy a

delicious Afro-Caribbean lunch, they also got to learn more about the fantastic work that BDB are doing to showcase and inspire people from **black and ethnic minority backgrounds**.

Many of our hosts used Insights22 as a vehicle for bringing people together from across different sectors to engage in a conversation and collaborate on some of the biggest challenges in our system, and that's exactly what the **HMPPS Transforming Delivery in Prisons** programme team did today. They were joined in Newbold Revel by a range of people from across the CJS who had a real opportunity to influence the design of the **prison regimes** model for the future.

If you wanted to find out more about the work of **Probation in court**, there were opportunities to meet with probation staff and sentencers at **Maidstone Magistrates** today, or spend the day in the life of a **Court Officer in Loughborough**. You could also hear about the pilot work taking place in Exeter by **South West Probation** region with **women who are at risk of recall**.

HMP North Sea Camp and **HMP Askham Grange** both opened their doors today, and you also had the chance to see the work taking place at **HMP Warren Hill**, developing employment opportunities for people on release with **New Futures Network**. In North Wales, **HMP Berwyn** showcased their **Accelerator Project** and you also had an opportunity to meet with their **Chaplaincy** team to find out more about the work they do to support people in prison.

In Manchester, guests took part in an interactive workshop with **Electronic Monitoring Services** to learn about, and try out, the innovative technology they are developing to enhance public protection and rehabilitation. In Nottingham, attendees got hands on with a creative workshop and tour of the **National Justice Museum.**

Online, the HMPPS Race Action Programme encouraged a conversation about how we can work better with the third sector to support people from Gypsy, Roma and Traveller backgrounds, and HMI Probation shared the principles of effective assessment in relation to black and mixed heritage boys in the Youth Custody Service. We also had a session by the HMPPS International team who were joined by HMPPS staff who had been seconded abroad, sharing their experiences of supporting prison and probation services in UK overseas territories.

Today, we also found out more about the work of the **Prisoners' Education Trust** and **Nacro**, and **Why Me?** gave us a helpful overview of their work in **restorative justice**.



Working in partnership with the **International Network for Criminal Justice**, we brought you a eight hour event, starting in Australia and ending in Trinidad & Tobago, with the England

and Wales section hosted by our colleagues in the **HMPPS Reducing Reoffending, Partnerships and Accommodation Directorate**. Each country had an hour slot to give us an insight into the particular challenges within their criminal justice systems and some of the innovative work they are doing to overcome it. Thanks to all of the countries that took part!

Back in the UK, there were opportunities to visit **HMP Frankland, HMPYOI Deerbolt**, and get involved in a physical education session at **HMP Brinsford**. You could spend a day in Kent, finding out more about the **Intensive Intervention and Risk Management Service (IIRMS)**, or enjoy a performance art workshop in Manchester with **OddArts**. Some lucky guests also got a chance to try out the **virtual reality** technology at the **University of Portsmouth** and learn about how it can enhance risk management training.

We were honoured to be able to offer opportunities for a couple of VIP guests to shadow Rachel Treweek, the Bishop of Gloucester, at the House of Lords today, spend a day in the life of Duncan O'Leary, CEO of New Futures Network or shadow a Nacro resettlement worker at HMP Wandsworth. In Newbold Revel, the HMPPS Transforming Delivery in Prisons (TDiP) team led interactive workshops on how we can overcome everyday errors through a systems thinking approach.

Online, the NPS Learning & Development team got us thinking about how to represent diversity and inclusion in virtual learning delivery, while the Prison Education Team explored neurodiversity issues in prison. HMPPS Insights Group gave us an update on their research into the use of force across the prison estate, and the MoJ Organisational Effectiveness let us in on the art of effective facilitation.






It was the final day of the Insights22 Festival but that didn't stop our hosts pulling out all of the stops to give staff some exciting learning experiences. And that was certainly true for the full day of demonstrations that the **HMPPS Operational Response and Resilience Unit** put on for guests at their training site in Kidlington, Oxfordshire. These specially trained staff (and dogs) are deployed to deal with the most serious incidents and emergencies across the prison estate in England and Wales, and we are lucky to have such dedicated and skilled staff on hand to support us. It was inspiring to see them at work.

Across in London, some of our VIP guests had an exhilarating (and windy) tour of the **London Air Ambulance** air pad and learn more about how this fantastic charity have continued to operate 24/7 during the pandemic to save lives across the region. Also in London, there was an opportunity to learn about their **Multi Agency Public Protection Arrangements (MAPPA)** and meet with the MAPPA leadership team. In Reading, a few lucky individuals had the opportunity to shadow staff at the **Elizabeth Fry Approved Premises**, and see first-hand their holistic approach to helping women resettle in the community whilst protecting the public.

Online, **Dr Cheryl Allsop at the University of South Wales** talked to us about the work she has been doing with **Locate International**, developing practical ways for students, community volunteers and investigative experts to work together on **cold case investigations**. As a team, they work on unsolved

murders, long term missing people and unidentified found remains, giving students real-life transferable skills on how to conduct investigations and problem solving more broadly. The event left many attendees wishing they were still students!

Also online, the **National Unpaid Work team** updated us on how **community payback** is contributing to the sustainability agenda, and **Manchester Metropolitan University** gave us some useful tips on how to start up a **podcast**. The **HMPPS Strategy Team** delivered a workshop to develop staff's **strategic thinking skills**, and **HMI Probation** engaged attendees in a conversation about the challenges and complications associated with supporting people who have both **mental health and substance misuse** problems.






