PENAL NOTICE

Any breach of this Order, failure to comply with it or threat to do so, can be certified to the High Court or the Court of Session under section 36 of the Act. A Court will deal with any breach, failure to comply, or threat of failure to comply as though it had occurred in proceedings before that Court.

The High Court and the Court of Session have the power to imprison or fine a person for any breach of this Order.

PURSUANT TO the Inquiry’s duties and powers under section 19 of the Inquiries Act 2005 (“the Act”);

AND UPON considering the application for anonymity submitted by Emma Hall of the Government Legal Department on behalf of her client Witness G on 14 January 2026;

IT IS ORDERED THAT

1. Witness G is granted anonymity so that their name and any identifying details cannot be disclosed or published in any form, unless express permission is given by the Chair of the Inquiry, or the Solicitor to the Inquiry acting on her behalf.
2. This Order remains in force for the duration of the Inquiry and at all times thereafter, unless otherwise ordered.

3. The Chair of the Inquiry may vary or revoke this Order by making a further order during the course of the Inquiry.
