 3 **MR BLAKE:** Thank you, Chair.
 4 **THE CHAIR:** Mr Blake, yes.
 5 **MR BLAKE:** Superintendent, we left off at 4.22 am. I'm now
 6 going to play two messages sent over Talkgroup 1199 from
 7 around 4.24. Those are NGPF0004748 and NGPF0004749.
 8 (Audio played)
 9 Thank you. We hear there PC Speeden asking to be
 10 updated about a search, about the search; is that right?
 11 **A.** I think he specifically asked about the identity of the
 12 offender.
 13 **Q.** Yes, and then PC Yallop alerts him with regards to video
 14 footage.
 15 **A.** Yes.
 16 **Q.** What we don't hear there is any repetition of the
 17 conversation we heard earlier, the update in terms of
 18 "All in black, fat build", the reference to going up
 19 Ilkeston Road and turning left into the estate, or the
 20 reference to Hopedale Close.
 21 **A.** Yes.
 22 **Q.** Thank you. If we could please then play NGPF0004751,
 23 and the time of this call is around 4.26. It's again
 24 Talkgroup 1199.
 25 (Audio played)

1

1 perhaps have intervened and clarified.
 2 **Q.** Again, as I say, we'll address that with the officers in
 3 due course. Today we're really focusing on the factual
 4 situation.
 5 Could we please listen to NGPF0005129, and then
 6 NGPF0005130 and then NGPF0005131. This is Talkgroup 7
 7 messages rather than Talkgroup 1199.
 8 (Audio played)
 9 So this is a conversation over Talkgroup 7, it's
 10 around 4.29. We heard a reference there to Hopedale,
 11 that's Hopedale Close.
 12 **A.** Yes.
 13 **Q.** The final message is from PC Brady-Johnson who had by
 14 that stage viewed the CCTV footage; is that right?
 15 **A.** Yes.
 16 **Q.** She said the perpetrator was wearing grey joggers
 17 underneath his black trousers.
 18 **A.** Yes.
 19 **Q.** We know also by reference, I won't bring it up onto
 20 screen, but by reference to NGPF0004763, that by 4.39,
 21 PS Hallam had also stated over Talkgroup 1199 that VC
 22 didn't look fat. There was a correction to the
 23 description of VC at around 4.39 on the other talkgroup.
 24 **A.** Yes.
 25 **Q.** But again, by this stage, there still doesn't seem to be

1 That's again a conversation between PC Speeden and
 2 PC Yallop.
 3 **A.** Yes.
 4 **Q.** PC Speeden refers to Ilkeston Road back up towards the
 5 city.
 6 **A.** Yes.
 7 **Q.** So it appears, although we'll hear from those officers
 8 in due course, but it appears that PC Speeden is not
 9 aware of that earlier message regarding turning left
 10 into the estate and Hopedale Close.
 11 **A.** Yes.
 12 **Q.** The reference, Ilkeston Road, "back up towards the
 13 city", is based on the old location that we've heard
 14 coming from some early 999 calls.
 15 **A.** Yes, so my view is it would have been desirable that
 16 when PC Speeden enquired about the identity of the
 17 offender, that the Control Room in clarifying we didn't
 18 know the identity of the offender, they perhaps could
 19 have updated him on the most recent direction of travel
 20 and description, and as you say that was not passed.
 21 Indeed, later, when PC Speeden passes that information
 22 to PC Yallop, that does not reflect, as you say, the
 23 most recent direction of travel or description and
 24 I would have expected it to have and in this event that
 25 PC Speeden didn't know it, that the Control Room would

1 any update in respect of the Hopedale or repetition of
 2 the reference to Hopedale over Talkgroup 1199. This is
 3 taking place, the conversations we just heard, are
 4 taking place over Talkgroup 7.
 5 **A.** Yes, the original communication about Hopedale was on
 6 1199, I think, yes.
 7 **Q.** Yes. But it hasn't been repeated at this stage.
 8 **A.** Yes.
 9 **Q.** Could we please listen to NGPF0007311. This is a radio
 10 discussion between CI Mather and Inspector Peter Shaw.
 11 The time we have is 4.32.
 12 (Audio played)
 13 So we heard there it's a conversation where
 14 Inspector Shaw is updating CI Mather as to events on the
 15 ground; is that right?
 16 **A.** Yes.
 17 **Q.** The reference to the "long gone now", that was, we
 18 heard, CI Mather's voice, was it?
 19 **A.** Yes.
 20 **Q.** Thank you. If we could go back to NGPF0010192, page 40,
 21 we're going to return to where VC is at this time. That
 22 conversation took place at 4.32 or thereabouts and we
 23 can see where VC was at 4.30. He is continuing
 24 eastwards towards the Forest Park & Ride; is that right?
 25 **A.** Yes.

1 Q. We can see there the red arrows show his direction of
2 travel?
3 A. Yes.
4 Q. So that's heading broadly northeast.
5 A. I think he's probably heading east by now, so I think he
6 went north from the scene and then changed his
7 orientation to east. I believe the direction of these
8 arrows is east.
9 Q. Thank you. The Forest Park & Ride, it's about a mile or
10 so north of the city centre; is that right?
11 A. Yes, I think about a mile from the scene as well,
12 I think.
13 Q. Could we please turn over the page, then, to page 41, VC
14 continues east, we can see the green areas, the Forest
15 Park & Ride car park and we can see him travelling along
16 Gregory Boulevard --
17 A. Yes.
18 Q. -- above the Forest Recreation Ground; is that right?
19 A. Yes.
20 Q. I won't bring it up on to screen, but at 4.41 the
21 Incident Log is updated after PC Hallam has reviewed the
22 Ring doorbell footage. That's NGPF0007971 again. We
23 don't need to bring it on screen and the reference, the
24 description at that stage has been updated to "male ...
25 all in black, doesn't appear fat".

5

1 the screen, perhaps we could zoom in on just the
2 right-hand side where the blue building is. That's
3 Seely Hirst House, thank you very much, and we see there
4 Mapperley Road.
5 Now there's another document, I'm not going to bring
6 it up on to screen but for everybody's reference it's
7 NGPF0001671. That relates to a person of interest who's
8 called Bill Monteiro, it's a name that may feature in
9 this Inquiry in due course.
10 Now, he appears to have had a previous address on
11 Mapperley Road. I should make clear that it's not for
12 the Inquiry to make any findings in respect of
13 Mr Monteiro's character. His relevance to the Inquiry
14 in due course will relate to the sufficiency of the
15 police investigation into his link between himself and
16 VC.
17 A. Okay.
18 Q. But I do highlight at this stage Mapperley Road is of
19 relevance in that respect.
20 A. Okay.
21 Q. VC reaches Seely Hirst House at 5.01; is that correct?
22 A. Yes.
23 Q. Then if we could please turn over to page 44. These are
24 some parts of the video that were shown when Ivan gave
25 his evidence, and we'll look at them again today in due

1 A. Yes.
2 Q. If we can turn over the page, please, to page 42, we see
3 travel from Ilkeston Road at the bottom, at 4.02, and
4 then the whole way to Mansfield Road at 4.41 on the far
5 right-hand side.
6 A. Yes.
7 Q. So that's about one and a half miles or thereabouts,
8 very approximately.
9 A. Yes.
10 Q. Over a course of approximately 40 minutes.
11 A. Yes.
12 Q. Can you assist us: is that a leisurely pace, doesn't
13 indicate that he was running or anything along those
14 lines?
15 A. No, it doesn't indicate he was running. I think you
16 could cover that in a brisk walking pace.
17 Q. Thank you. If we could go over the page, please, to
18 page 43. Now we see there in blue, Seely Hirst House;
19 is that right?
20 A. Yes.
21 Q. This is the route the police consider is likely to have
22 been taken by VC in the dotted line, whereas the yellow
23 line is Magdala Road.
24 A. Yes.
25 Q. Now if we could focus, please, on the right-hand side of

1 course. This is Seely Hirst House.
2 A. Yes.
3 Q. Could we please turn to page 46. We can see on this
4 video that VC briefly leaves Seely Hirst House at 5.10
5 but then returns to the building; is that right?
6 A. Yes.
7 Q. Over to page 47, please. Thank you. So at the moment
8 time, this is 5.10, Ian Coates can be seen driving his
9 van along Magdala Road. Is that what we see in the top
10 right-hand corner?
11 A. Yes.
12 Q. In the bottom right-hand corner we can see there Magdala
13 Road where the van is seen at 5.11. We also see some
14 tennis courts there. That might in due course become
15 relevant because I think there's a reference to tennis
16 courts in one of the 999 calls.
17 A. Yes.
18 Q. Can we now play NGPF0007783. This is the video of Seely
19 Hirst House. It has been played to the Inquiry before,
20 in -- when Ivan gave his evidence, but it hasn't been
21 live streamed so we're going to play it again now.
22 *(Video played)*
23 I think we can see VC coming down the screen now,
24 walking down.
25 A. Yes.

1 (Video played)
 2 We get there a good picture of VC's shoes that he's
 3 wearing at this stage.
 4 A. Yes.
 5 Q. Quite different from the shoes we saw at the very
 6 beginning of your evidence.
 7 A. Yes.
 8 Q. You can also see in the description that was provided
 9 over the talkgroup in relation to wearing what appeared
 10 to be grey tracksuit trousers underneath the black
 11 trousers.
 12 A. Yes.
 13 Q. You can see a flash of another colour under there.
 14 A. Yes.
 15 (Video played)
 16 So there he's left Seely Hirst House but returned.
 17 A. Yes.
 18 (Video played)
 19 We're now going to see a number of CCTV captures of
 20 VC thereafter.
 21 (Video played)
 22 He comes back again to Seely Hirst House.
 23 A. Yes.
 24 (Video played)
 25 Q. By this stage he's taking something out of his rucksack.

1 of the attack on Ian Coates.
 2 A. Yes.
 3 Q. As I said, the audio of that is captured at 5.14, 5.15.
 4 If we go over the page, we can see that reference, and
 5 that's been obtained subsequently from the CCTV footage
 6 that we can see on the left-hand side of the screen?
 7 A. Yes.
 8 Q. Thank you, Superintendent. We've just covered the
 9 period of time from the first 999 call at 4.03 up until
 10 the attack on Ian Coates at 5.14, 5.15. I want to now
 11 look at where the police were during that relevant
 12 period. I'm going to bring onto the screen a document
 13 that's been produced by Nottinghamshire Police, it's
 14 NGPF0003785, please. Thank you. This document has been
 15 produced using police telematics; is that correct?
 16 A. Yes.
 17 Q. If we scroll over the page, we can see. Are you able to
 18 assist us as to how that information is obtained, very
 19 briefly?
 20 A. Yeah, so police vehicles are fitted with specific
 21 technical equipment, so lights and sirens, as one would
 22 expect, but also some data retrieval technology which
 23 allows us to retrospectively obtain the data from
 24 a specific vehicle which can tell us it's whereabouts
 25 but also certain things about the status of the vehicle,

1 It's inside a shopping bag?
 2 A. Yes.
 3 Q. This may be a question for another officer, but are you
 4 aware that that is a pole of some sort inside?
 5 A. From later in the chronology and the body worn I've seen
 6 at the time of his arrest he was in possession of
 7 a steering lock that seemed similar shape and size.
 8 I think it probably is that item.
 9 Q. Thank you.
 10 (Video played)
 11 He's now continuing towards Magdala Road at this
 12 stage.
 13 A. Yes.
 14 (Video played)
 15 Q. There's audio of the attack on Ian Coates captured at
 16 5.14 am, and we can see there the white van. And by
 17 this stage VC is driving the van?
 18 A. Yes.
 19 Q. Thank you. Can we please bring on to screen NGPF0010192
 20 again, page 48, and this photograph shows the direction
 21 that VC travelled along Mapperley Road to Magdala Road.
 22 The last CCTV spotting of VC is at 5.13, identified by
 23 that red dotted line; is that correct?
 24 A. Yes.
 25 Q. Then we see at the top of the picture in yellow the area

1 if it's moving or not, if the indicators, lights, sirens
 2 are being used or not.
 3 Q. Thank you. We have here the vehicle that PC Reynolds is
 4 driving and that's in a pale colour, yellow-ish dots; is
 5 that correct?
 6 A. Yes.
 7 Q. Then the green dots are VC's direction of travel?
 8 A. Yes.
 9 Q. If we start at row 1 of the telematics data, so that's
 10 at the bottom of the screen to the left-hand side of the
 11 screen --
 12 A. Yes.
 13 Q. -- we can see 4.18, PC Reynolds is in the area of
 14 Ilkeston Road; is that right?
 15 A. Yes.
 16 Q. Then if we look in the middle at the bottom, row 50, we
 17 can see that by 4.21, PC Reynolds is south of Ilkeston
 18 Road?
 19 A. Yes.
 20 Q. Appears to be searching broadly that area that's south
 21 of Ilkeston Road. If we go -- we can see number 60, for
 22 example, 4.22 is still travelling along Derby Road. And
 23 that was the road, in fact, that we discussed earlier,
 24 wasn't it, in relation to another incident, I think
 25 there was reference to Derby Road?

1 A. Yes.

2 Q. Looking at row 90, so that's towards the top of the page
3 on the left-hand side --

4 A. Yes.

5 Q. -- we can see at 4.25, PC Reynolds had travelled
6 northwards, and in fact at that time he is quite close
7 to where VC is travelling, and we see 4.25, he's
8 travelling northwards and we can see that green dot at
9 4.15 to 4.21 which was VC's location. So he's just
10 behind VC's path; is that correct?

11 A. Um --

12 Q. VC is going -- he'll be ahead on the right-hand side as
13 we can see.

14 A. Yes, you are correct they're in roughly the same area.
15 The scale of the map may be slightly misleading to how
16 it feels to be on the street in that location. It's --
17 although close on the map, it's several streets away.

18 Q. Thank you. Then, if we look at the top entry row 237,
19 by 4.48, PC Reynolds has gone quite north of where VC
20 is, north of Gregory Boulevard, sorry.

21 A. Yes.

22 Q. Thank you. If we can go on to the next page, please,
23 it's page 3. Thank you. If it's possible to zoom into
24 that map, that will be very helpful. Thank you.

25 This is PC Smedley and PC Cooper. We can see their

1 Q. That is towards Ilkeston Road, or on Ilkeston Road.

2 A. Yes.

3 Q. Between 4.13 and 5.00 am, this officer is again largely
4 around Ilkeston Road, some searching in the Cathedral
5 and the Park Tunnel area; is that right?

6 A. Yes, it appeared to me he'd conducted extensive
7 searching in all the surrounding area.

8 Q. The surrounding area of the Cathedral and Park Tunnel
9 area?

10 A. The Cathedral and the Park, also Derby Road and Ilkeston
11 Road itself and the Radford Boulevard area, and indeed
12 some of the streets in the Hopedale Close area that
13 we've referenced.

14 Q. Thank you, and the reference there 183 Gregory Boulevard
15 isn't until 5.13, so that's much later on.

16 A. Yes.

17 Q. The next page, please, page 5. This is PC Crabtree.
18 What we see there again, largely south of Ilkeston Road
19 and the Cathedral area; is that right?

20 A. Yeah.

21 Q. We don't see searches around the kind of area that we've
22 seen those green dots relating to VC.

23 A. Yes, so this is Derby Road and Ilkeston Road in the
24 Cathedral area, so to the east and the south as you
25 describe, and then the three or four dots which are

1 locations if we look at row 24, so at 4.12 they are at
2 Ilkeston Road.

3 A. Yes.

4 Q. They're heading towards the city centre and south of
5 Ilkeston Road, so at this period not near where VC is
6 travelling; is that right?

7 A. Sorry, what was the time reference?

8 Q. So the first one is row 24, 4.12.

9 A. Yes.

10 Q. At that time these officers are at the scene --

11 A. Yes.

12 Q. -- and I don't think we have any information that
13 suggests that they are travelling north.

14 A. No, I think what this map tells us is that these
15 officers drove up Derby Road and then drove down
16 Ilkeston Road towards the scene. So my recollection of
17 this pair of officers was that they conducted a search
18 of the areas the suspect was believed to be on their way
19 to the scene, which they arrived at at 4.12.

20 Q. Thank you. If we can turn then to page 4, this
21 PC Whysall.

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. If we could zoom into that, thank you very much, we can
24 see row 1, 4.13 again.

25 A. Yes.

14

1 north of the red star we can see is the Hopedale Close
2 area that was referenced.

3 Q. Thank you. Page 6, please. This PC McAuley, similar in
4 the sense that it is largely around Ilkeston Road area,
5 city centre Cathedral area. Again, not close to those
6 green dotted areas.

7 A. He does cover all the areas you describe but I think he
8 probably does some of the most extensive searching in
9 the areas north of the red star, which is the Hopedale
10 Close area that we've mentioned.

11 Q. Yes, and that's around 4.23, we can see those boxes on
12 the left-hand side, 37-45, 4.23 to 4.24.

13 A. Yes, so I think that's about five minutes after the --
14 that Hopedale information is passed by PC Marshall.

15 Q. Then if we move on to page 7, we have PC Jamieson and
16 PC Chapman, a very wide-ranging area covered by those
17 officers but again, south, largely, of VC's travel.

18 A. Yes.

19 Q. Over the page, please, to page 8. This is PCs Abid and
20 PC Nunley, PC Abid will be relevant for reasons I come
21 to in due course.

22 A. Yes.

23 Q. Their search again seems more focused on the Cathedral
24 and Park Tunnel area. We can see all those entries from
25 ten to 180 all around the Park Tunnel and St Barnabas

1 Cathedral, Derby Road, area; is that correct?
 2 **A.** Yes, I believe this was the callsign that responded to
 3 those two emergency calls in that area and the incident
 4 that was created in 69.
 5 **Q.** Thank you. Moving on to page 9, we have PCs Spibey and
 6 PC Knight. We can see there row 1 is north of Ilkeston
 7 Road but that's essentially south -- southerly travel to
 8 the scene at 4.30. We can see --
 9 **A.** Yes.
 10 **Q.** -- quite a lot of movement around 4.33 in the area that
 11 you've described, the Hopedale area --
 12 **A.** Yes.
 13 **Q.** -- just above Ilkeston Road.
 14 **A.** Yes, that's correct.
 15 **Q.** If we could go to page 10, please. This is PC Yallop
 16 and PC Bower.
 17 **A.** Yes.
 18 **Q.** If we look at row 75 at 4.25, that's the top right-hand
 19 side.
 20 **A.** Yes.
 21 **Q.** Also 82, which was to the left of that, 4.26, we can see
 22 in fact they are quite close to VC's direction of travel
 23 around the time that he is in that general area.
 24 **A.** Well, they're at one end of the Forest Recreation site
 25 and Gregory Boulevard at 4.26. I think we know from
 17

1 that were sent over audio talk groups, it's NGPF0004755,
 2 NGPF0004756, NGPF0004757, and NGPF0004762. These all
 3 occur from around 4.34 am.
 4 *(Audio played)*
 5 That's the voice of Force Incident Sergeant Gavin
 6 Berry, is it?
 7 **A.** Yes.
 8 **Q.** Thank you.
 9 *(Audio played)*
 10 Thank you. So we've heard there PC Yallop, PC Bower
 11 and PC Whysall are all going to the Derby Road area; is
 12 that right?
 13 **A.** Yes, and I think I also heard PC Speeden.
 14 **Q.** Yes, so PC Speeden says he'll be free from the scene
 15 shortly and will redeploy --
 16 **A.** Yes.
 17 **Q.** -- again towards the Derby Road area?
 18 **A.** Yes.
 19 **Q.** Can we please play NGPF0007312. This is a discussion
 20 that takes place at 4.42, or thereabouts.
 21 *(Audio played)*
 22 Thank you. That's a discussion between the Force
 23 Incident Sergeant Gavin Berry and PC Abid who
 24 I mentioned earlier.
 25 **A.** Yes.

1 earlier slides that VC emerged from Maple Street at the
 2 other end of the Forest Recreation site at the Park &
 3 Ride at 4.30, so four minutes later but yes, in
 4 a similar area.
 5 **Q.** But essentially travelling in the opposite direction?
 6 **A.** Yes.
 7 **Q.** They're heading down Gregory Boulevard and VC's
 8 direction of travel is to the right of our screen.
 9 **A.** Yes.
 10 **Q.** If we could go over the page, please, to page 11, this
 11 is PC Kenna and PC Read.
 12 These are much later times, 5.20, 5.30 times, all
 13 around the Cathedral area; is that right?
 14 **A.** Yes.
 15 **Q.** Finally, over the page, please, to PC Luxton and
 16 PC Hope, if we can zoom into that, thank you very much,
 17 we can see the red star on Ilkeston Road and a great
 18 deal of their search is around the Ilkeston area towards
 19 the city centre, south of where VC was at that time?
 20 **A.** Yes, so this callsign, and the one on the previous
 21 slide, my understanding is they were officers from the
 22 neighbouring area that came in specifically to assist
 23 with the return to and more thorough searching of the
 24 Cathedral area.
 25 **Q.** Thank you. I'm going to now play a number of messages
 18

1 **Q.** The reference there to St Barnabas, is this again all
 2 the Cathedral area?
 3 **A.** St Barnabas is the Cathedral.
 4 **Q.** Thank you. The incident is essentially that other call
 5 that was received earlier in the evening that we heard?
 6 **A.** Yes, the two calls, and incident 69.
 7 **Q.** Thank you very much.
 8 Can we please play NGPF0005140, and this is
 9 Talkgroup 7, our note is 4.47.
 10 *(Audio played)*
 11 So you said at the beginning that Talkgroup 6 and
 12 Talkgroup 7 had been patched together?
 13 **A.** Yes.
 14 **Q.** Can you assist us with what this technical issue was at
 15 this stage?
 16 **A.** I can't help, I'm afraid, I don't know what the details
 17 were of that.
 18 **Q.** Can we please listen to NGPF0007314 and our note is
 19 4.50 am.
 20 *(Audio played)*
 21 That's a discussion between the Force Incident
 22 Sergeant and PS Barnett from a neighbouring area.
 23 **A.** Yes.
 24 **Q.** Can you assist us with how a neighbouring area may
 25 become aware of your incidents and how it is that that
 20

20

1 conversation happened?
 2 **A.** In terms of how the conversation happened, my impression
 3 from the audio, which is all that I've heard, is that
 4 Sergeant Barnett had made an enquiry if he or his team
 5 could assist with the Ilkeston Road search that he was
 6 aware of was going on. Sergeant Berry became aware of
 7 that enquiry and contacted him directly to make him
 8 aware of how they might assist specifically, assist him
 9 with the search for incident 69.

10 In terms of how Sergeant Barnett became aware and
 11 what caused him to make that enquiry, I'm not sure.

12 A couple of potential explanations might be some
 13 response officers will monitor Talkgroup 1199 in their
 14 vehicles, and in the sort of opposite way to how you'd
 15 describe firearms officers would monitor a local
 16 talkgroup, for situational awareness of significant
 17 incidents around the force. Some sergeants also are
 18 just monitoring the incidents as they're coming in in
 19 live time, so exactly the circumstances such as this,
 20 anything of significance they can offer support.

21 **Q.** So the incident logs that we have seen --

22 **A.** Yes.

23 **Q.** -- does the neighbouring force have access to those?

24 **A.** The neighbouring area, yes. If they were aware of the
 25 incident number, they could monitor them and, depending

1 **Q.** Thank you. It sounds as though the focus in that call
 2 has very much shifted by this stage to that other
 3 incident in terms of the search that was being carried
 4 out; do you agree with that?

5 **A.** Um --

6 **Q.** Perhaps that's a matter of opinion and we don't need to
 7 address it?

8 **A.** Yes, I'm not sure I'd quite put it in that way. I'd --
 9 we'd characterise that call as the second occasion the
 10 Control Room are contacting the inspector on the ground
 11 to see if he needs additional resources. The sergeant
 12 took the opportunity to make him aware of the jobs in
 13 the area of the Cathedral and the resources he had
 14 tasked with that search, and also to make him aware that
 15 some of those resources could be repurposed in support
 16 of any objectives the inspector had if required.

17 **Q.** Thank you. If we could go back to NGPF0010192, please,
 18 which is our photo flip chart. Could we please go to
 19 page 50, and we're going to look at the progress of the
 20 white van at this stage.

21 This time we're now on at 5.15, so the same time as
 22 that call over -- between the Force Incident Sergeant
 23 and Inspector Shaw. We see there VC driving down from
 24 Magdala Road down towards the city centre, down
 25 Woodborough Road; is that correct?

23

1 on their level of safe access, they could see incidents
 2 as they were being created.

3 **Q.** At this stage, as we've heard, the focus was on the
 4 off-duty police officer's call, the other incident that
 5 we've already spoken about.

6 **A.** Yes.

15 **A.** Yes.

16 **Q.** PC Yallop and Bower were also in that area?

17 **A.** Yes.

18 **Q.** PC Whysall the same?

19 **A.** Yes.

20 **Q.** Thank you. Could we please play NGPF0007317, we're now
 21 at around 5.15.

22 *(Audio played)*

23 That's a discussion between the FIS and
 24 Inspector Pete Shaw; is that correct?

25 **A.** Yes.

2 **Q.** That's essentially a B road that leads directly to the
 3 city centre?

4 **A.** Yes, it's one of the main roads to the city centre.

22 **Q.** Could we please bring up on to screen NGPF0007952 at the
23 same time 5.26, this is the contact record.
24 It says there:

2 **Q.** Thank you. We're now going to listen to two messages
3 over Talkgroup 1199, it is NGPF0004783 and NGPF0004785.
4 Our time for this is 5.26.
5 *(Audio played)*
6 I believe the first of those messages is the Force
7 Incident Sergeant deploying PC Yallop and PC Bower to
8 Milton Street; is that correct?

9 **A.** Yes.

10 **Q.** The second is PC McAuley offering to search the area and
11 PC Whysall and another shouting up and responding?

12 **A.** Yes.

13 **Q.** Can we please listen to NGPF0004787, again on -- this
14 one is on Talkgroup 1199, the time we currently have for
15 that is 5.27.
16 *(Audio played)*
17 That sounds like the Force Incident Sergeant
18 instructing PC Yallop and PC Bower that the priority is
19 the injured male at that stage?

20 **A.** Yes.

21 **Q.** Can we please listen to NGPF0004788, again
22 Talkgroup 1199, and the time we have for this is 5.27.
23 *(Audio played)*
24 Is that the Force Incident Sergeant asking
25 Sergeant Barnett if they have other units available?

1 Is that pedestrians? That's my reading of it.

2 **A.** Yes, it is, yes.

22 direction of travel is the red arrow?

23 **A.** Yes.

24 **Q.** We can, in fact, see on the top right-hand corner is the
25 dash-cam footage from PC Reynolds's car?
26

1 **A.** Yes.

2 **Q.** If we could go over the page, please, then. Police then
3 follow the van. In the bottom right-hand side we see
4 a picture there that covers the area of impact where
5 Sharon Miller and Marcin Gawronski were hit.

6 **A.** Yes.

7 **Q.** And if we can see there on the top right, the time on
8 the police dashboard is 5.29. So that's approximately
9 14 minutes after VC entered the van.

10 **A.** Yes.

11 **Q.** If we could please turn over the page, we can see then
12 the direction of travel of VC, after that. He continues
13 in the van down Alfreton Road into Bentinck Road, and
14 that's where we can see the arrow, and it's at Bentinck
15 Road where VC is ultimately arrested.

16 **A.** Yes.

17 **Q.** Thank you. I'm going to move on to some video footage
18 of the -- of what we've just seen. We will pause it
19 after just before a minute 45 and we'll take a short
20 break after that. So could we please bring on to screen
21 NGPF0007782. If you're able to talk us through the
22 roads you see as the video progresses, that would be
23 helpful.

 2 quite busy there at the same time as Chief Inspector
 3 Mather was trying to establish the whereabouts of the
 4 armed officers, and the armed officers were asking for
 5 details of the suspect vehicle. Sergeant Barnett, as
 6 you've also described, was also trying to update on the

 22 that call?

- 24 **Q.** Can you assist us with what you heard?
- 25 **A.** What PC Yallop is saying there is he thinks Talkgroup 7

 24 should go to page 9, if we could turn to page 9, and
 25 this is PC Yallop and PC Bower. Could we start, please,

- 1 A. Operation Plato is the identifier for a marauding
 2 terrorist attack, so marauding is talking about where
 3 somebody who is motivated by terrorism is seeking to
 4 kill or seriously harm people and continue to find more
 5 victims to continue to kill or cause serious harm.
 6 An Op Plato declaration is a national plan which
 7 mobilises all three emergency services and indeed other
 8 partners. Specifically in relation to armed policing,
 9 it activates contingency plans which provide additional
 10 armed resources and other specialist resources to
 11 support the location of the Operation Plato declaration.
 12 Q. Thank you. We see a few entries below there is an entry
 13 at 5.30 "SR442 - I need more units". Is that Dean
 14 Reynolds, I think he's SR442, saying that he needs more
 15 units?
 16 A. I'm sorry I can't recall that what that is.
 17 Q. I think you have a separate document with various
 18 callsigns.
 19 A. I did before the break. It seems to have vanished.
 20 Q. It's okay. If we look at a couple of entries below we
 21 see "cr410 - veh[icle] in sight on [and that's] Alfreton
 22 Road".

 24 Q. Can you assist us with what that may be?

2 **A.** It tells us that Op Plato has been declared, the
3 location of the Op Plato declaration is Milton Street in
4 Nottingham city centre it specifies the type of
5 incidents is a vehicle has driven into pedestrians.

6 In terms of hazards, it mentions the van has left
7 the scene. That's because the location of the suspect
8 or the threat is relevant to the deployment of ambulance
9 service and fire service and their considerations around
10 the safety of their staff.

11 In terms of access, it specifies Lower and Upper
12 Parliament Street. "Number of casualties", it says at
13 least five units there, which doesn't quite make sense.
14 But I think it's referring to the five casualties, as we
15 understand it, from Ilkeston Road, Milton Street and
16 Upper Parliament street, and then "emergency services",
17 ambulance and fire requested.

18 **Q.** Thank you. If we can go over the page, please, to 5.36,
19 about three-quarters of the way down this page. We see
20 there it says:

21 "Moving all St Anns units ... to 1199 and to Maple
22 Street/Forest Rec area".

23 Is that exactly the issue we just looked at?

24 **A.** Yes. That entry is exactly consistent with what I would
25 expect for the audio we heard a moment ago.

1 **Q.** Is that correct? Thank you. Could we please then go
2 back to NGPF0005224 and just in terms of timing to see
3 where we're at, at page 9, so we just looked at the call
4 at 5.35. Towards the bottom of the page we have entries
5 for 5.35:

6 "OF48 - Male is detained believe this [i]s the male
7 from stabbing taser has been deployed."

8 So is that the report that VC by that stage at the
9 same time had been detained?

10 **A.** Yes.

11 **Q.** If we go over the page, please, to page 11, we see
12 halfway down the page there at 5.36, it's over the page,
13 something headed "Methane". Can you talk us through
14 that, please, and just assist us with what methane is?

15 **A.** Yes, so Methane is something that we would use when we
16 declare an Operation Plato or indeed for another major
17 incident where we work with other blue light services.
18 It's part of what's called the JESIP principles, which
19 is emergency service interoperability.

20 So a Methane message is mnemonic which is understood
21 by the police service, as well as ambulance, as well as
22 the fire service, and it's a succinct *aide memoire* to
23 ensure that key information is recorded and disseminated
24 to all emergency services to enable them to mobilise
25 appropriate resources in a timely manner.

25 **Q.** Then PCs Goddard and Speeden saying they were out of

1 medical capability; is that right?

2 **A.** Yes.

3 **Q.** One final audio, it's NGPF0004931. The time we have for
4 this is 5.40.

5 *(Audio played)*

6 Thank you. Are you able to assist us with that,
7 please?

8 **A.** Yes, so that was PC Speeden who was the duty OFC,
9 Operational Firearms Commander, clarifying with the TFC.
10 I think he makes reference to acknowledging there wasn't
11 an opportunity for a full briefing before the updates
12 from VC's location and ultimately VC's arrest took
13 place. He's seeking clarity from the TFC, Chief
14 Inspector Mather, if there's any further specific
15 information or briefing he needs to be aware of as the
16 Operational Firearms Commander.

17 Chief Inspector Mather clarifies there's no further
18 briefing other than to confirm that all tactics are
19 available and that his priority is that the armed
20 officers remain available to any new or emerging threat
21 that may come to light. And then he directs them to the
22 city centre.

23 **Q.** Thank you very much, Superintendent Allardice.

24 There are more audio messages that we haven't
25 covered today. We will address them in due course with

1 other witnesses, and in respect of the evidence you've
2 given today, you're going to be coming back on 16 and
3 17 March, so further questions will be put to you on
4 that occasion.

5 So far as today is concerned, that is all of the
6 questions, I think, you'll be asked by me.

7 **THE CHAIR:** Yes, thank you.

8 I understand that there's a chronology and agreed
9 timing which is currently, as it were, going the rounds
10 for agreement with the Core Participants and I'm hoping
11 and expecting, in fact, that agreement can be reached,
12 even there are a couple of minutes out and there is
13 a notice on that saying that there is a slight
14 disagreement if no agreement cannot be reached. I'm
15 sure that that can be agreed. We have listened to, I'll
16 say, some quite difficult calls to decipher one way or
17 another and it would be very helpful to have that. It
18 may not be possible to do it until we've heard the
19 evidence from the other officers who are coming and
20 speaking to some of that, but I'm sure that it can be
21 achieved. Thank you.

22 Well, we'll finish there for today and we'll start
23 again tomorrow at 10.00.

24 I understand, in fact, it's Sergeant Reynolds who is
25 coming tomorrow, is that correct, and Mather?
