## THE NOTTINGHAM INQUIRY

---

### FIRST WITNESS STATEMENT OF CHRISTOPHER HOSKINS

---

I, Christopher Hoskins, of the University of Nottingham, University Park, Nottingham, NG7 2RD (the “**University**”), will say as follows: -

#### **INTRODUCTION**

1. I am employed by the University, currently as a Senior Operations Manager in the Halls Management Team. I joined the University in February 2021 as a Residential Experience Manager within the University’s Residential Experience (“**ResX**”) Team and was promoted to Senior Residential Experience Manager in June 2022.
2. This witness statement is made to assist the Nottingham Inquiry (the “**Inquiry**”) with the matters set out in the Rule 9 Request dated 26 June 2025.
3. I am asked about my background. I have a degree in psychology and sociology, and a Masters in business studies. I have worked within residence services for the last decade in a variety of roles across various higher education institutions.
4. ResX is a team of University employees which was established in 2021. Before then there was a warden service. It is a community building service for students living at various halls of residence. We have three main functions.

Firstly, we support low level wellbeing issues, which we consider to be any issues where the immediate risk of severe harm to an individual or others is low. Such issues include home sickness, difficulties settling into university life and academic concerns. Secondly, we have a behaviour management role, including helping to resolve conflict and offering mediation. We were officers of summary jurisdiction under the University's Code of Discipline and can manage less serious cases of misconduct under the Student Code of Conduct (non-academic) that replaced the Code of Discipline; therefore, we have a disciplinarian aspect to our roles. Finally, we deliver events and activities to students. Students sometimes talk to us because we are out and about on campus, or they can email or phone us. It is a reactive role. There was a summary of what the ResX team did in emails sent to students before arrival, newsletters and the like.

5. ResX covers University-owned premises and some third-party owned accommodation, purpose built student accommodation ("**PBSA**"), if there is a nomination agreement in place between the University and a PBSA provider that includes a package for that provider to pay the University for the ResX service. That PBSA is then listed on the University website alongside University-owned accommodation. PBSA is generally adjacent to University campuses.
6. Within ResX, there was a Head of Residential Experience and three managers of which I was one. Each manager was responsible for different geographic areas. In my role as Residential Experience Manager, I was responsible for the delivery of the residential experience provision across a set of geographic locations, including on the University's Jubilee, University Park and Sutton Bonington campuses. One of the halls we covered was Raleigh Park. Raleigh Park was third-party PBSA and was not owned or managed by the University. It was a partnered provider, and Raleigh Park had signed up for the optional ResX package through a nomination agreement and so was treated in the same way as University-owned accommodation by ResX.

7. My role included triaging issues: working out where the student needed to go and what service to access. For example, if we knew a student had finance concerns we would refer them to the finance team. If a student had emotional issues, such as feeling worried about a particular exam or feeling lonely, then we could support them ourselves, or give them the option of speaking to the Support and Wellbeing team.
8. If we are concerned about a student, then we will alert wellbeing services or the Mental Health Advisory Service (“**MHAS**”). The Support and Wellbeing teams are based in the schools and we are based in the halls of residence, so we refer between ourselves. If a student is concerned about exams then the school Support and Wellbeing team would probably lead, but if students are concerned about something to do with accommodation, like a flatmate being difficult, we would take the lead. We would call Security to assist if needed, although I have only called Security on a handful of occasions.
9. If there is anything to suggest a risk of self-harm or harm to others, or a suggestion of any psychological condition, we would pass on to MHAS. We did not carry out risk assessment save in the most general way in that if we thought there might be a risk to a student or others we would get other services involved. Even if a student said in passing ‘I would rather kill myself than do my exam tomorrow’ we would immediately refer to MHAS; we had a very low threshold for referral to MHAS. I was clear that if a student posed a risk to the safety of others, I would involve other agencies: if it was an immediate risk I would call the police, otherwise depending on the situation I would call Security and/or MHAS.
10. I am asked whether the ResX team have any pastoral or disciplinary roles in relation to students. I have described the pastoral role above. As described, we were officers of summary jurisdiction. At the time, I did deal with disciplinary cases within halls of residence up to a threshold, such as incidents when there was excessive noise made or a student covered a smoke detector.

Any more serious disciplinary issues were dealt with by the Conduct and Investigation team.

11. My relationships with the Support and Wellbeing team and MHAS were supportive and responsive. Whenever we escalated an issue, we received support. I am asked whether there were any guidelines or procedures which set out or explained that relationship. There was general University-wide guidance about when to escalate to MHAS which we followed, such as the '*Identifying and Responding to Students in Difficulty: A guide for staff*' [UNIN0001628]. I felt that it was sufficiently clear to me about where to refer students in various situations.
12. I am asked whether I or the services I managed/supervised interacted with the police or NHS mental health services. I have never called the police in relation to ResX matters. I would theoretically contact the police in the same way that I would in any situation, if there was an emergency, but that has never happened. My interactions with NHS mental health services would be limited to providing practical support to NHS people who come onto campus, such as providing access to premises.
13. I am asked to exhibit any policies or procedures which regulated the relationship between the University and the police or external mental health services. I would not know about those policies in my role. I am asked to exhibit any policies, guidance or procedures I used in the ResX team in relation to student wellbeing, how to deal with mentally ill students, risk assessment, student safeguarding and the disciplinary process. The policies which we used were not ResX policies: there were University-wide policies and guidance about the various teams and procedures (e.g. safeguarding, conduct) which I understand are being exhibited by others.
14. I have received training about safeguarding, and in induction training I was trained about the various University services. I have done mental health first aid training several times in my career. That focuses on short term crisis

management if we are first on the scene until appropriate services can step in.

### CHRONOLOGY

15. I have been asked to set out a chronological account of my contact with Valdo Calocane, who I will refer to as VC throughout this statement.

16. I have been shown Document UNIN0000125 which is a log of ResX interactions. I believe that document was created when I was on leave to pull together ResX material relating to VC, but I did not create it.

#### Events in 2020 and 2021

17. I was not aware of VC in 2020 or 2021.

#### Events in 2022

18. I first became aware of VC on 17 January 2022. I received an email around 9am from Jamie Dickinson, Off-Campus Affairs Manager, who forwarded a report that he had received from a student who lived with VC and four other students at Raleigh Park [UNIN0000732]. It fell within my area of responsibility and not Jamie's as this was a partner location.

19. The student, Chris [GRO-B] reported that he had been assaulted by VC and that VC had trapped him and his flatmate in the flat. The police attended but the student reported that because he had not sustained any injuries from VC, the police had allowed VC to stay in the flat. The student noted that VC didn't "*seem the most stable of people*" and reported that the incident was causing him a lot of stress and anxiety and that he didn't feel safe [UNIN0000732].

20. Just before 10am, I received an email from Rebecca Patterson, Assistant Scheme Manager at Raleigh Park [UNIN0001783]. Rebecca was not a

University employee, she was employed by the third-party provider. In her email, she said:

*"Hi Chris*

*As discussed, please see attached.*

*Kind regards*

*Rebecca".*

21. To her email, Rebecca attached an email from Chris [GRO-B] to Mahalia Palmer in the Raleigh Park team, sent on 16 January 2022 at around 6.17pm [UNIN0001786]. Chris' email had a PDF document attached to it which was headed "*Statement from Flat 15*" and contained information about other issues VC's flatmates had had with him prior to the 17 January 2022 incident [UNIN0001788]. I recollect that I spoke to Rebecca earlier that morning, but I do not recollect discussing this statement with her. Amongst other things, the statement said:

*"This is not the first issue this member of the flat has caused with his inappropriate behaviour. He has previously walked into the bedroom of other flat members with no prior warning, one of which, Sam [GRO-B] had just got out of the shower and could have been in a state of undress, which fortunately he was not. This worrying behaviour is further demonstrated when he walked into Abdullahi [GRO-B]'s bedroom unannounced whilst he was asleep to ask him 'did you hear that screaming'? As far as we know there was no screaming";*

*"In the case of the 15th of January he assaulted a member of the flat in response to being asked to clean a shower he had left in the following condition. This shower had been in a clean condition before his use that day, he admitted it had been him that had caused the issue and simply said 'I don't feel like it' when asked to clean up after himself. The general disregard for flatmates quality of life and occasional outright aggression to fellow flatmates*

*on top of a physical assault, involving attempted punches has lead us to unanimously request his removal or relocation from Flat 15. The main reason for this request is our personal safety and living standards which he has clearly shown a disregard for in his criminal actions and his numerous breaches of the tenancy agreement”;* and

*“...his presence has caused other members anxiety to the point they do not want to use areas such as the kitchen whilst he is present due to his aggressive and violent previous behaviour. We feel this constitutes a serious and persistent breach of the tenancy agreement and urge the landlord to use his powers to seek a relocation or removal of this member of the flat. We feel clause 7.42 is relevant in this regard. Any further communication of this matter would be greatly appreciated and we hope to have this matter resolved as quickly as possibly, as his current presence is causing considerable amounts of stress on to the other tenants”.*

22. As far as I am aware, none of the pre-15 January 2022 incidents mentioned in the flatmates’ statement had been reported to ResX previously. I do not recollect reading this statement at the time and do not recall forwarding to anyone else in the University, but I think I would have discussed this with colleagues, although I have no specific recollection of this. At this point my focus was on dealing with the incident to hand, which was the one that had occurred on 15 January 2022.

23. I rang Chris GRO-B but received no answer. I then (just after 10am on 17 January 2022) sent him an email outlining my role and suggesting that we discuss his concerns further [UNIN0000194]. The student emailed me back to advise me that he would call me either later that day or the day after. I enquired as to whether he felt safe remaining in the flat and tried to arrange a specific time to speak. The student informed me that we could speak at any point the next day and that he would be spending that evening at his girlfriend’s [UNIN0000194]. I was awaiting more information from the student about the 15 January 2022 incident before deciding what further referrals to

make – my impression was that this was quite a low level incident: the student was not showing any urgency in wanting to talk about it and nobody else had reported the incident to us. I knew the police had been involved, had visited the flat, had presumably spoken to all parties involved, and had apparently been content to leave VC and other students in the flat. I would expect the police to have flagged with the University if they were concerned about other students being at risk from VC.

24. I understand that it is the recollection of Claire Thompson, Associate Director (Student Wellbeing), that ResX notified the Support and Wellbeing Service/MHAS that day, that I spoke to her that day and that she noted these things in an incident report [UNIN0000157, UNIN0000362] – I don't have a recollection of that but that is what I would expect to have happened.

25. The ResX Team received an email from Claire Thompson at around 18:30 on 17 January 2022 advising us that VC was known to MHAS and that MHAS's last contact with VC had been in August 2020. Claire informed us that MHAS would follow up the next day but that if there were further concerns that evening and people were concerned about VC or his behaviour, the police should be called for support. Claire suggested that it may be worth someone checking in with the other flatmates that evening [UNIN0000260]. As Claire's email had arrived in the evening, and as the police had assessed the situation, we did not contact the students until the next day.

26. Ellie Turner emailed me on the morning of 18 January 2022, around 09:30 to ask if she could speak to me about VC. I emailed her back an hour or so later to provide my mobile number [UNIN0000183]. Ellie then emailed again around 11:00 asking me to confirm VC's full address. I emailed this to her a few minutes later [UNIN0000183]. I spoke to Ellie (one of several conversations with her that day) and she advised me that it wasn't safe for the other students living in the Raleigh Park flat to remain there. I agreed to try to find them alternative accommodation [UNIN0000734, UNIN0000381].

27. On 18 January 2022, I emailed Rebecca a few times, including to let her know that Ellie Turner had asked that Rebecca's team contact her (Ellie) if they saw VC and to call the police if he appeared agitated in any way [UNIN0001483] and regarding finding alternative accommodation for the students remaining in the flat with VC. Rebecca provided me with the contact details of the affected students and informed me that accommodation elsewhere in Raleigh Park was empty and in a different block to VC's flat so the students could move there [UNIN0001483, UNIN0001680].

28. At around 12:28 on 18 January 2022, I emailed one of the affected students, Abdullah [GRO-B] [UNIN0001789] as follows:

*"Hi Abdulla*

*My Name is Chris, and I am the Residential Experience Manager for students living within Raleigh Park. My role is to make sure students feel safe and are supported.*

*I understand that you were involved in an incident over the weekend where the Police were called to your apartment, and that you are currently experiencing issues with another student within your flat?*

*I have tried to give you a call, but could not get through. I understand that this is not an easy thing to talk about, but if you feel comfortable doing so, I would be grateful for the opportunity to talk to you further about this situation and let you know more about the support that is available to you and how we can stop these incidents from happening in future.*

*You can give me a call on [GRO-B] or let me know when would be a convenient time to call you back".*

29. From the above, it seems that I tried to call Abdullah, but I do not recollect this or whether I called any of the other affected students. I didn't e-mail any of the

other affected students along the lines of the email that I sent to Abdullah and I do not recall why, but I think it is likely that I didn't because I went to help the affected students move out of the flat.

30. I attended the Raleigh Park flat on 18 January 2022 and supported the students with their move. My recollection is that the other students were not particularly concerned about the situation, and not worried that VC was a risk to them. They were worried about the impact on their exams of having to move and the inconvenience. I informed them of the emergency protocol, i.e. in an emergency they should contact Security or the police (that was communicated to students when they moved into accommodation and the number for security was on posters, etc) [UNIN0000381, UNIN0001819]. I recall that VC was in the flat at the time of the move but that he was asleep in his room.

31. Around 14:00 in the afternoon of 18 January 2022, Ellie emailed me details of the Approved Mental Health Professional ("AMHP") who was going to assess VC under the Mental Health Act [UNIN0001202].

32. At 14:14 on 18 January 2022, Rebecca Patterson sent me an email [UNIN0001790] attaching an email from Chris [GRO-B] [UNIN0001796] in which Chris had said:

*"Hi,*

*As you are aware me and the other members of Flat 15 have been temporarily move to Flat 35 due to reasons outside our control, We have no cooking utensils or food and have told not too enter Flat 15 for our own safety. We will have to resort to buying takeaways, we're students and this is costly for us. Is it possible Raleigh park could be able to provide any financial assistance in regards to this?*

*Many thanks,*

*Chris [GRO-B]*

33. Rebecca asked me what she was able to say to Chris regarding timescale

and compensation. I do not believe I responded to this email, although it is likely that I would have spoken to Rebecca about it, although I do not have a specific recollection of this. In a conversation with Rebecca I expect I would have told her that this was not a matter for ResX to consider, but that it was one for the Raleigh Park team or that she could speak to the University's accommodation team about it.

34. At 16:58 on 18 January 2022, I emailed Rebecca Patterson again to provide her with the Emergency Department Team number of the NHS Crisis Team, which Ellie had provided to me in a call. I believe that I liaised with the AMHP by telephone in relation to access to Raleigh Park. I advised Rebecca that the AMHP handling VC's case had asked that if her team at Raleigh Park witnessed anything unusual or concerning about VC, they should contact the Crisis Team or that they should call 999 if there was a risk to himself or others. I shared the advice that nobody should approach VC overnight [UNIN0001680]. Rebecca responded, advising me that she would pass the relevant numbers on to the Raleigh Park security team [UNIN0000125].

35. At 09:22 on 19 January 2022, Ellie Turner emailed me to let me know that VC had not been assessed the day before as there was no place of safety available in Nottingham and risks were felt to be mitigated because VC's flatmates had moved into alternative accommodation. Ellie said that she had left a message for the senior cover at the Local Authority who would be allocating the Mental Health Act assessments that morning and that she was awaiting a call back with an update on a time for the AMHP and the police to attend Raleigh Park [UNIN0001311, UNIN0000125]. Ellie emailed me again at 12:20 and told me that the AMHP and the police would be attending VC's accommodation at 1pm that day to execute the warrant and take VC to the hospital for assessment [UNIN0001485]. Ellie provided the AMHP with my number so that I could liaise with the team at Raleigh Park. I obtained a key card from the Raleigh Park Team so that I could let the police into VC's accommodation to execute the warrant.

36. I was present when the AMHP arrived. I was there to facilitate access and to support any other student who might be distressed by witnessing the incident. A significant number of police arrived with an ambulance. I let them in and escorted them to VC's flat on the top floor of the building. I let them into the flat and I also went into the flat to show them which door was VC's bedroom. VC was taken by ambulance for assessment.
37. I emailed Ellie Turner, Mark Davis and Claire Thompson at 14:18 on 19 January 2022 to inform them that VC had been taken for assessment and that the AMHP had said that the assessment would take place around 15:00 and that she would provide an update after that [UNIN0001528]. I am not aware whether that update was provided.
38. On 19 January 2022 I learned that VC had not been detained and was to return to Raleigh Park and so the other students should remain in alternative accommodation – I think this information came from Ellie by telephone. I was told by Rebecca Patterson that Raleigh Park did not want VC to return there. I would have passed that on to Ellie, as from a University point of view Ellie was taking the lead in this situation. I understand that there are MHAS notes which record that I passed this information to Ellie in a telephone call on 20 January 2022 which sounds right to me [UNIN0000734].
39. On 27 January 2022, Ellie emailed me to advise that another Mental Health Act assessment had been called for VC. Ellie had passed on my number in case help was needed accessing VC's accommodation [UNIN0000640]. I replied to Ellie's email at 16:35 to tell her that the Raleigh Park Team had just updated me that VC had confirmed he wanted to leave and would be giving them a date of departure by the end of the week [UNIN0000145].
40. I received an update from Tony Lewis, Raleigh Park Scheme and Contracts Manager on 29 January 2022 by email, informing me that VC had been taken from the site by police and ambulance on the previous evening [UNIN0000517].

41. MHAS informed me that VC was detained and that we would be given notice before he was released. Although I cannot remember the time of that conversation, I understand there is an MHAS note on 31 January 2022 logging a call from Ellie to me with that information [UNIN0000734]. On 3 February 2022, I emailed VC's flatmates to confirm that VC would not be returning in the immediate future. I advised them that if they felt comfortable doing so, they could move back into the flat from their alternative accommodation [UNIN0000318].
42. I recall a telephone call with Ellie Turner, in which she asked me to ask the student who had reported the incident if he would be happy to be contacted by the NHS. When I received Ellie's call, I was just about to call the reporting student to alert him to the email that I had just sent. He confirmed that he was happy for his number to be shared with the NHS. I called Ellie back and passed his number on to her.
43. I have been asked to expand, insofar as I am able, on my recollection as to how Chris [GRO-B] contact details, or the contact details of VC's other flatmates, were passed on to external mental health practitioners. I do not have any further information other than as set out above in relation to the sharing of Chris [GRO-B] contact details, and I did not request contact details from VC's other flatmates for the purpose of sharing this information with external mental health practitioners. I have also been asked whether I can expand on the process taken to obtain Chris [GRO-B] and VC's other flatmates' contact details for the purpose of providing this information to external mental health practitioners, but I do not have any further information to provide on this. As set out above, I had planned to telephone Chris [GRO-B] to follow up my email from 3 February 2022 and, when I did, I raised the request for sharing of his contact details with the NHS. Chris agreed that he was happy for this information to be shared so I provided his contact details to Ellie to be passed on.

44. As I recall it, the reporting student phoned me later on 3 February 2022 to let me know that VC had been to Raleigh Park. That was a surprise as I thought he was detained in hospital and had not been told otherwise. I established that the reporting student was safe and then called Ellie to let her know that VC had been in the flat – I didn't get any detail of what happened [UNIN0000734].
45. On 8 February 2022, the Raleigh Park team informed the ResX team by email that VC had officially moved out of his accommodation at Raleigh Park [UNIN0001304]. Rebecca Patterson from the Raleigh Park team updated VC's ex-flatmates as to this, also on 8 February 2022 [UNIN0001830]. On 9 February 2022, I emailed Ellie at 18:06 to let her know that VC had fully moved out of Raleigh Park and the other students were returning to the flat [UNIN0001323].
46. On 21 April 2022 at around 9pm, the ResX team was told by email by Ansumana Dibba (Jobe) in the Raleigh Park team that VC had gone to Raleigh Park on 21 April 2022. Jobe advised that VC had been seen on site at around 19:45 and when questioned about his presence had said that he was visiting a friend. VC had provided false information and was asked to leave the site and not to return. Jobe indicated that they had undertaken a welfare check on VC's old flat and that the tenants had said that VC had been at the flat 2 hours previously and was able to access the flat because the door had been left unsecured [UNIN0001066].
47. On 21 April 2022, Chris GRO-B (the student who had reported being assaulted on 15 January 2022), called the ResX Team at 20:20. I did not speak to Chris myself, but a colleague logged that Raleigh Park security had seen VC outside Chris's accommodation block with a balaclava and that Raleigh Park security had moved him on and alerted Chris to his presence. Chris was reportedly not too concerned but wanted to let the team know. He was advised to contact security and/or the police if he saw VC and that extra patrols of the area would be carried out that evening [UNIN0000125]. I understand that my colleague,

Debbie Keown, a ResX Coordinator, e-mailed Chris **GRO-B** on 22 April 2022 to provide safety advice [UNIN0001801], including:

*“...should Valdo make a further appearance, call the police immediately and follow this up with a call to Raleigh Park security and ResX so we can check on your welfare.*

*A reminder of Raleigh Park security number – **GRO-B** and they work 5pm-8am Mon-Fri and 24/7 Saturday and Sunday.*

*The ResX team can be contacted any time between 9:00 – 3.30 Monday to Friday and 18:00 – 3.30 Saturday and Sunday...”.*

48. I believe I was on leave around this time. When I was back, on 26 April 2022, I passed the information I had about the above incident of 21 April 2022 to Ellie. By then I had more details about what had happened from the other residents. I informed Ellie that we had learned from following up with the residents of VC's old flat that day that VC had followed someone through their block entrance and managed to get into his old flat as the door had been left open. VC had entered the flat without knocking and had encountered the student who had reported the initial incident. VC asked the reporting student about mail and was informed that there wasn't any mail for him and was asked to leave, which he did. I informed Ellie that VC had not been aggressive or confrontational and that the reporting student felt safe, although also felt that the incident was strange. I asked Ellie whether MHAS could check if VC was OK and reiterate boundaries [UNIN0001354].

49. Ellie advised me that she had shared the information regarding the incident with the NHS team and that VC had completed his studies but would remain a registered student until graduation [UNIN0001437].

50. I do not believe that I had any further communication about VC after this point. Apart from seeing VC when he was being taken for assessment by the police and NHS, I did not have any direct contact with VC at any point. I would not have provided him with support once he was being supported by MHAS and

the NHS.

51. I am not aware of any other occasions on which VC was detained at or admitted to hospital because of mental illness during the time he was a student at the University. I am not aware of any other interactions which he had with police or security services. I am not aware of any complaints made to the University about the behaviour of VC. I would not expect to have that kind of information in my role unless it was necessary for me to know in the context of providing support to students. I am not aware whether the University commenced any disciplinary / misconduct investigation into any complaints made about VC.

### **OBSERVATIONS**

52. I am asked whether I think I should have been told more about VC's behaviour while at the University, his mental illness and/or his interactions with the police. No, I do not.

53. I am asked whether looking back, I think there are additional actions that I or the University could have taken in respect of VC. Generally, I think that I and the ResX team escalated the situation appropriately. In relation to alerting other flatmates, I now think it may have been best to make contact with them all on 17 January 2022, the same day that we received the report, to check that they were alright. That is with the benefit of hindsight and at the time we were aware that police had visited and decided they weren't at risk. I do not think that contacting them all on 17 January 2022 would have made any difference, as when we did check in with them two days later they did not report any more untoward behaviour from VC, and were not concerned. From my point of view, it seems that things were escalated appropriately to MHAS and then from them to the NHS, so I don't see what else could have been done.

54. I do not identify structural issues (such as guidelines/policies, training, organisational structure, communication with others in or outside the University) which contributed to any issues I have identified.

55. I am asked what recommendations I think the Chair of the Inquiry should make to ensure lessons are learned and to prevent similar attacks in the future.

56. I think there should have been better communication from the NHS to the University. I was really concerned that VC was released from hospital in February 2022 without us knowing that he was out of hospital and turned up at the Raleigh Park accommodation (I now understand this was a day release). I would have wanted the NHS to tell us about that. He had been deemed a risk so we had to move students out of the flat, but the students had moved back in because he was in hospital. I thought we would be told if he was released from hospital, but we were not told about this day release and so could not keep an eye out for him at Raleigh Park or alert his flatmates.

57. I do not have recommendations for improvements that could be made to the University or to the higher education sector generally in how they deal with acutely mentally ill students and/or students who pose a risk to the safety of others.
