

THE NOTTINGHAM INQUIRY

SECOND WITNESS STATEMENT OF AMISSÃO CALOCANE

1. I make this statement in response to a Rule 9 request sent to my solicitor on 24 April 2026 and further to my first witness statement **WITN0086001**.
2. This statement is based on my knowledge and beliefs. Where any information is not from my own knowledge or belief I make that clear below. I reserve the right to amend this statement when further documents become available.

My father's mental health problems

3. At paragraph 21 of my first statement, I referred to having told Dr Seedat that my father had mental health problems. I have been asked to provide more information about this.
4. When I was around 15 years old, which was 44 years ago, I remember that I was at school in the city. There were no schools for older children in our village so I used to stay in the city during the week and then travel back to my home village at the weekend. I was told by a relative that my father was having 'problems in the head'. I then went back to my village at the weekend and saw my father and it was obvious that there was something wrong with him as he did not recognise me. He did not know I was his child. He was usually very affectionate with me and so this was very different and very upsetting. I was told that he also didn't recognise other people and he would sometimes get lost and not know where he was. Around that time, a relative also told me that something similar had happened when I was 1 or 2 years old but I did not remember that.
5. I remember that after that incident, some family members took my father away for a few months closer to family who could look after him, so I did not see him

for a while. When he came back to the village and I visited at weekends, he seemed ok. It was not something we really talked about.

6. I do not know what the problem was with my dad and I do not know if he had psychosis. As far as I am aware, he did not see any doctors as there were none in the village. I do not know if he had any treatment.
7. I don't remember my father having any further problems after that. He died when I was around 20 years old.

My relationship with Valdo

8. At paragraph 7 of my statement, I stated, "Valdo was a well-behaved child. There, were occasions, as with any family, when we would have arguments. Particularly when he was a teenager [...]". I have been asked to provide more information regarding this.
9. I do not remember there being many arguments and those that did happen were not serious or severe. They did not involve shouting or raised voices. The main thing which I remember caused some issues was around Valdo going to church. At some stage, Valdo said he did not want to go to church anymore. Church was very important to me and my wife and so this was very disappointing. I was firm in telling him what I believed was right - that he should attend church. This didn't involve me shouting at him but more trying to encourage him and persuade him to go. However, he would not listen and eventually, we gave up trying to convince him. I do not remember how long this went on for.

Document NGPF0003027

10. I have been provided with a copy of document NGPF0003027 by the Inquiry which is a document that I have not seen before. I have been asked for my recollection of the incident referred to on pages 3 and 4.

11. I had completely forgotten about that incident as it happened over 16 years ago. I cannot remember much detail about what happened other than the following: I was at home with Elias. Celeste and Valdo were not there. I remember that I asked Elias to do the dishes and he wanted to play on his play-station instead. I asked him a few times to do the dishes but he did not want to.
12. I cannot remember if Elias got angry or shouted and I do not remember anything about a scratch. I remember that the police knocked on the door and said that Elias had called them. I remember being very surprised as nothing big had happened. The police spoke to Elias and I believe they told him that he should just have a conversation when things like that happened.
13. I do not remember when Celeste and Valdo came back or whether the police were still there.
14. Nothing like this ever happened again.

RIO notes [NHFT0000168]

15. I have been told that the RIO notes [NHFT0000168] contain an entry on 19 October 2020 by Gary Carter, which says "Spoke with Mr Calocane who took my name and number for future reference. He says he has spoken with Valdo who says he is fine...". I do not remember anything about this and I cannot remember speaking on the phone with anyone from mental health services.

Statement of truth

I believe that the facts stated in this witness statement are true. I understand that proceedings for contempt of court may be brought against anyone who makes, or causes to be made, a false statement in a document verified by a statement of truth without an honest belief in its truth.
